

## 105 ILCS 5/2 State Board of Education: Powers and Duties

### Committee on Mandate Review.

The State Board of Education shall create the Committee on Mandate Review. The Committee on Mandate Review shall, when requested by a member of the General Assembly, be charged with reviewing, assessing and reporting to the General Assembly the financial, staff, and other impact pending legislative mandates have on school districts in Illinois. The report shall include regional impact and cost analysis for the pending legislative mandate.

### Committee Membership.

The members of the Committee on Mandate Review shall be appointed by the State Superintendent. The membership shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

- i. The State Superintendent or his/her designee;
- ii. A representative of a school a school district organized under Article 34 of this Code;
- iii. A representative of a statewide organization representing individuals employed by a school district organized under Article 34 of this Code who hold professional educator licenses One representative of a teacher representing Chicago Public Schools;
- iv. One superintendent representing suburban school districts;
- v. One individual who holds a professional educator license and is employed by an Illinois suburban school districts;
- vi. One superintendent representing rural school districts;
- vii. One individual who holds a professional educator license and is employed by an Illinois rural school districts;
- viii. One superintendent representing unit school districts;
- ix. One individual who holds a professional educator license and is employed by an Illinois unit school districts;
- x. One school business official representing school districts in tier 1 or tier 2; and
- xi. One school business official representing school districts in tier 3 or tier 4.

### Process for Review of Pending Mandates.

The Committee shall meet at the call of the Superintendent when a Fiscal Note is sent to the State Board of Education for a bill that would create a new mandate for schools in Illinois. The State Board of Education shall consult with the Committee on Mandate review and submit a report to the General Assembly within five business days of the filing of the Fiscal Note. Committee shall have five business days to review the pending legislation. The report shall include, but is not limited to, the following:

- i. Analysis of the potential cost to implement the mandate by each school district type (unit, rural, suburban, and CPS);
- ii. Analysis of the potential staff time/staff needed to implement the mandate by each school district type (unit, rural, suburban, and CPS);
- iii. Analysis of the resources currently available for consistent implementation by each school district type (unit, rural, suburban, and CPS); and
- iv. Analysis of any duplication of mandates that are already required by school districts related to the pending legislative mandate.

25 ILCS 50/1 Fiscal Note Act

If a bill, either directly or indirectly, requires the expenditure of funds by local school districts, the State Board of Education shall have prepared, prior to second reading in the house of introduction, an explanatory statement that includes the following;

- (i) A reliable estimate of the fiscal impact of its provisions upon local school districts;
- (ii) A reliable estimate of the impact of its provisions upon school district employee time;
- (iii) A reliable estimate of the regional fiscal impact of its provisions upon unit school districts, rural school districts, and suburban school districts;
- (iv) A reliable estimate of its provisions upon school district employee time by unit school districts, rural school districts, and suburban school districts; and
- (v) An explanation of the methodology used to develop the estimates required above.
